

## CHAPTER 2

### PARKING REGULATIONS

#### 5-2-1: Parking:

##### 5-2-1-1: Parking Not to Obstruct Traffic:

It is unlawful for any person to park any vehicle upon a street, in such a manner or under such conditions as to leave available insufficient width of the paved portion of the roadway for free movement of vehicular traffic.

##### 5-2-1-2: Parking Prohibited at Specified Times on Certain Streets; Parking of Certain Vehicles Prohibited:

- A. Parking of vehicles is prohibited at all times on both sides of Sunset Drive from its intersection with Holiday Drive west to its terminus; provided, however, that this Section shall not be applicable to police vehicles.
- B. The parking of the following types of vehicles is hereby prohibited on all streets within the Village:
  - 1. Trailers of any kind; and
  - 2. Any truck tractor or road tractor (commonly known as a semi-tractor), with or without any trailer or semi-trailer attached.
- C. The Director of Village Maintenance is hereby directed to immediately post signs and erect such barriers so to give reasonable notice of the parking prohibitions relative to the aforesaid Village streets as provided by this Chapter.

##### 5-2-1-3: Signs; Obedience to Signs:

The Director of Village Maintenance has power, subject to the approval of the President, to designate by appropriate signs that no parking is permitted under the conditions described in this Chapter. Where signs have been erected upon any street as authorized herein indicating that parking, standing or stopping is prohibited or is prohibited during designated hours or prohibited for a longer time than is designated, or limited to a specific manner of parking, it shall be unlawful for any person to park, stand or stop any vehicle on said street in violation of any such signs.

##### 5-2-1-4: Parking in Violation of Zoning Ordinance Prohibited:

It shall be unlawful for any owner, lessee, or driver of any vehicle to park or store said vehicle in violation of Section 9-5-6 of the Village of Holiday Hills Zoning Ordinance (Title 9 of this Village Code, as amended from time to time), and it shall be unlawful for the

owner, lessee, or resident of any property within the Village to permit the parking or storage of any vehicle on said property in violation of Section 9-5-6 of the Village of Holiday Hills Zoning Ordinance (Title 9 of this Village Code, as amended from time to time).

5-2-1-5: Winter Parking:

It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to park said vehicle, or for the owner or lessee of said vehicle to permit said vehicle to be parked or to remain parked, on any Village street or right-of-way at any time after snow begins to fall, if the snow on the streets exceeds two inches (2”) in depth, provided that said parking restriction shall continue during snow removal operations until completed.

5-2-1-6: Authority to Determine and Designate Parking for Handicapped Persons; Parking for Handicapped Persons; Penalty:

A. Authority to Determine and Designate Parking for Handicapped Persons:

The President and Board of Trustees shall have authority to determine and designate by ordinance or resolution those streets or parts of streets upon or in which parking shall be prohibited except as to the motor vehicles being operated by or for a person with disabilities or a disabled veteran bearing registration plates or decals issued to a person with disabilities, as defined by Section 1-159.1 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, pursuant to Sections 3-616, 11-1301.1 or 11-1301.2 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, or to a disabled veteran pursuant to Section 3-609 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, or a person with disabilities parking decal or device containing the international symbol of access issued to persons with disabilities by any local authority, state, district, territory or foreign country issued to a person with disabilities or to a disabled veteran or bearing other appropriate evidence that the motor vehicle is operated by or for a person with disabilities or a disabled veteran. Upon approval of such a separate ordinance or resolution by the President and Board of Trustees, the Village shall cause to be erected appropriate signs or curb markings giving notice thereof.

B. Parking for Handicapped Persons:

It shall be prohibited to park any vehicle which is not bearing registration plates or decals issued to a person with disabilities, as defined by Section 1-159.1 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, pursuant to Sections 3-616, 11-1301.1 or 11-1301.2 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, or to a disabled veteran pursuant to Section 3-609 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, as evidence that the vehicle is operated by or for a person with disabilities or disabled veteran, in any parking place, including any private or public off-street parking facility, specifically reserved, by the posting of an official sign as designated under Section 11-301 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, for motor vehicles

bearing such registration plates. Any motor vehicle bearing a person with disabilities license plate or a person with disabilities parking decal or device containing the international symbol of access issued to persons with disabilities by any local authority, state, district, territory or foreign country shall be recognized by State and local authorities as a valid license plate or device and receive the same parking privileges as residents of Illinois.

C. Penalty:

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Chapter, or any amendment thereto, any person found guilty of violating the provisions of this Chapter shall be fined Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) in addition to any costs or charges connected with the authorized removal or storage of any vehicle under this Chapter, or any amendment thereto. Each day a violation occurs or continues shall be considered a separate offense.

5-2-1-7: Notice on Illegally Parked Vehicle:

- A. Whenever any vehicle is parked in violation of the provisions of any ordinance prohibiting or restricting parking and there is no person in attendance upon such parked vehicle to be arrested or served immediately with a traffic violation notice to appear in court to answer the charge of such violation, any police officer observing such violation may attach to the vehicle used in such violation a traffic violation notice so that the person in whose name such vehicle is registered may appear in court on a certain day and at a designated courtroom to be named in such notice and answer to the charge of such violation.
- B. It shall be unlawful for any person, other than the driver of the vehicle to which said notice is attached, to remove the same from said vehicle.

5-2-1-8: Presumption in Reference to Illegal Parking:

Whenever any vehicle shall have been parked in violation of any of the provisions of any ordinance prohibiting parking or restricting parking, the person in whose name such vehicle is registered shall be prima facie responsible for such violation and subject to the penalty therefor, provided, however, no person who is the lessor of a vehicle pursuant to a written lease agreement shall be liable for the violation of any ordinance prohibiting or restricting parking involving such vehicle during the period of the lease unless such lessor fails to provide the name, address, and driver's license number of the lessee within forty-five (45) days of receipt by such lessor of a request by the Village for such information made within ninety (90) days after the violation occurred. The driver's license number of a lessee may be subsequently individually requested by the Village if needed for enforcement of this Chapter.

5-2-1-9: Village Authorized to Tow Vehicles Illegally Parked and Relocate Vehicles in Emergencies:

- A. Any vehicle parked on any Village property or on any Village street in violation of this Chapter may be immediately removed at the direction of either the Director of Village Maintenance, or her designee, or the Chief of Police, or his designee.
- B. The Director of Village Maintenance, or her designee, or the Chief of Police, or his designee, is hereby authorized to remove and/or have removed any vehicle parked upon any street, when necessary due to any emergency, due to road reconstruction and/or maintenance, or other exigent circumstances.
- C. All costs incurred for the removal and/or storage of any such vehicle as authorized by this Section shall be paid by the owner or lessee of such vehicle. Upon the dispatch of a tow for any vehicle by the Village, the owner or lessee shall be immediately responsible for charges levied by the towing company if the vehicle is removed prior to the arrival of such tow.

5-2-1-10: Parking of Vehicles with Expired Registration:

No person may stop, park, or leave standing upon a public street, highway, or roadway a vehicle upon which there is no valid registration plate or plates displayed or upon which there is displayed registration plate or plates or registration sticker after the termination of the registration period for which the registration plate or plates or registration sticker was issued or after the expiration date set under Section 3-414 or 3-414.1 of the Illinois Vehicle Code. Any person, firm or corporation violating this section shall be fined \$25.00 for each offense. Each day on which a violation occurs or continues shall be considered a separate offense.

5-2-1-11: Parking on Culverts and Other Drainage Structures Prohibited

It shall be unlawful to stop, park, store, or leave standing any vehicle on top of or so as to block or obstruct any exposed metal or concrete culvert or other drainage structure.
